



JERSEY

One of the two main islands in the Channel Islands, Jersey is located in the English Channel near the coast of France. A self governing territory, the islands have developed a vibrant financial services industry. Jersey is also known as a popular holiday destination for both French and British tourists and is rich in history having survived occupation in World War Two. Its primary industries are financial services, horticulture, agriculture and tourism.

Cost of Living: Jersey enjoys a very high standard of living with relatively low cost of living.

Accommodation: Rental accommodation can prove quite expensive. Expatriates must have a Housing Licence to avail of cheaper housing. This is usually granted with the work permit.

Transport: Driving is on the left and there is an excellent public transport system. You must have an original copy of your international driving licence and remember that the speed limit is 40mph.

Socialising: The quality of life is hard to match with a wide range of sporting pastimes and an active social environment. There are regular trips to France and companies organise friendly inter-company competitions.

Dress Code: As in Ireland, the office dress code is professional but depends on the company policy.

Taxation: Tax rates are very favourable at 20%.

Getting There: Employers generally pay the cost of relocation and 1 flight a year. There are daily flights to the UK.

Visas: Although technically part of the UK, expatriates must have a valid work permit which the company would apply for on your behalf. Documents required include notarised copies of academic qualifications, medical certificate, employer references and at least 2 references of good character.
